In the short time that the Butler County Weatherization Program has been in existence our team has been able to help over sixty-nine (69) families "weatherize" their homes. Families have been able to get those insulation issues resolved before the cold weather hits. Insulation is just one of the many ways our team is weatherizing homes in Butler County. Eligible clients are receiving home energy audits in which their heating systems, insulation, weather-stripping and caulking are all being inspected. We currently have seventy-five (75) in progress and another one hundred twenty-five

(125) eligible clients in our system. These milestones are being achieved because of the hard work of our dedicated Weatherization team. Every day we are receiving "notes of thanks," from our clients.
